

## What You Can Do With a Computer at School

There are many things you can do with the computers at school.

You can:

- Take a test on a book you read.
- Use web pages your teacher has picked out for you.

### Be Careful!

## Rules for Using School Computers

- When I use a computer at school, I will only do what my teacher has told me to do.
- I will not damage the computers at my school.
- I will follow all Computer Lab rules.
- I will not tell my password to anyone, not even my friends.
- I will not type my name or anything about myself on the computer without direction from my teacher.
- If I see something that makes me feel bad, I will tell my teacher and not show other students.
- I will not use a computer or other technology to bully others.
- If I use a picture or words from a webpage, I will show where I got it from in the work I do.
- I will use appropriate words when online.

## What Happens if You Break the Rules?

Always ask before using the computer at school. If you do not follow these rules, your teacher may not allow you to use the computer any more!

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### Information for Parents/Guardians

Because technology is such an integral part of today's society, using technology during school is a critical component of your child's learning experiences. We take every precaution possible to ensure your child's safety while using these educational tools. Please help us teach your child appropriate use of technology by discussing the information in this document and encouraging them to adhere to the rules at all times. If you or your child have any questions or concerns, please contact his/her teacher.

### Home Use of the Internet for Learning

Parent involvement and supervision are critical to ensuring your child's safety on the Internet. Yucaipa-Calimesa Joint Unified School District assists you in this by providing home access to resources that support your child's learning. The following are examples of the resources available at home as well as school:

- Online Library Catalog: Search for books in the school library by reading level or topic. Print a list to take to school the next day.
- Research tools: Students can research a topic using safe, educational resources provided by the District. Access online encyclopedias, magazines, newspapers, and other reference works. These resources also provide links to external websites that have been reviewed for educational appropriateness.
- School Web Site: Your school's web page provides direct access to the aforementioned resources and class web pages where teachers can post additional resources selected to support your child's learning. 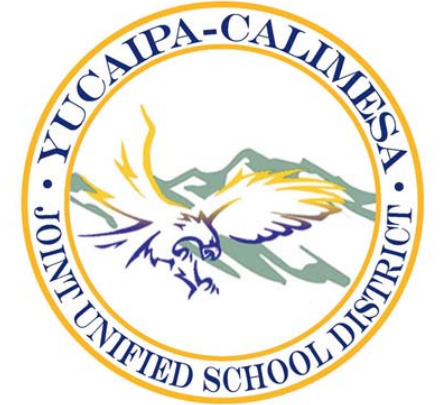
By signing the school's Emergency Release Card, you acknowledge your rights and responsibilities as described in this Responsible Use Agreement (RUA).

### Vandalism/Disciplinary Action Statements

**\*Vandalism:** Vandalism is defined as any malicious attempt to harm or destroy electronic hardware or software. This includes, but is not limited to: defacing equipment; uploading or creating computer viruses; destruction of data of another user and/or any other agencies or systems that are connected to the network. Any vandalism will result in the loss of computer services, disciplinary action,\* and legal referral.

**\*Disciplinary Action:** Being granted access to online services is a privilege and there are consequences for not exercising responsible behavior in the use of digital equipment and services. According to Board Policy 6163.4, students who do not adhere to the user obligations and responsibilities as outlined in the *Student Responsible Use Agreement for Computer & Internet Access* shall be subject to revocation of the user privilege and disciplinary action. For the first time offense, the user account is revoked until a meeting takes place with the student, his/her parent, and representative of the District. On the basis of the level of the offense, the user privilege may be revoked for the remainder of the semester or 30 days (whichever is more) and may be revoked for the next semester. In addition to revoking the user privilege, disciplinary action will result. Such action will be in accordance with procedures at the specific school site regarding messages indicating or suggesting pornography, unethical and/or illegal solicitation, racism, sexism, inappropriate language, and any other inappropriate use of technology. Vandalism, as defined in BP/AR 5131.5 – Students: Vandalism, shall result in revocation of user privilege, disciplinary action, and legal action as appropriate. Students are subject to all of the laws and regulations of the United States and are subject to legal action as appropriate.
